BUSINESS MONITOR SUMMARY

During March 2016, Council's Economic Development Unit surveyed businesses in the Heidelberg West industrial estate to understand businesses priorities, issues and constraints. The results from the businesses that completed the survey are summarised below:

- » The majority of businesses (80%) have been operating for 10 or more years, 66% within the Heidelberg West industrial estate.
- » The majority of businesses (61%) employ less than 10 people. No business employs 100 or more people, and only 5% employ 50-99 people.
- » The majority of employees (64%) across the estate are full time.

SUPPORTING AND DEVELOPING A VIBRANT PRECINCT

The 2015 - 2020 Banyule Economic Development Plan identifies the need for vibrant industrial precincts that provide a focal point for business and community life, and stimulate vibrancy and economic prosperity.

To improve its knowledge of businesses operating in the Heidelberg West industrial estate and to leverage further economic development outcomes for the community, Banyule Council's **Economic Development Unit** conducted a survey in March 2016.

This piece of work has been vital in informing the Victorian Planning Authority (VPA), who guides the growth in metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria.

The Heidelberg West industrial estate is located in the La Trobe National Employment Cluster, one of the six National Employment Clusters (NECs) as identified by the Victorian Government's Plan Melbourne document. The La Trobe NEC delivers a significant contribution to the national economy and has the capacity to further enhance Melbourne's competitive position within the global economy.

During 2016, the VPA consulted with the community living and working within the La Trobe NEC to test preliminary ideas and help formulate the future land use. development and infrastructure planning for the area. Throughout 2017, the VPA and Council will work together to develop a Precinct

Structure Plan (PSP) for the Heidelberg West industrial estate. The PSP is an overarching strategic planning framework to guide long term future development and identify crucial transport and community infrastructure required to support the evolution of the Heidelberg West industrial estate into a modern business environment with high employment density.
